Do we live in a region in the same way as we live in a country? Do Europeans have a regional sense of belonging alongside their national identities? The Visegrad Four and the Western Balkans are two macro-regions within the larger Eastern European area, with rather contrasting approaches to these questions. Geographically and historically close, both regions share comparable characteristics on the macroregional level, yet represent two different categories of regions in the European patchwork.

The freshly published book, a collection of studies on identity issues, shows how national identity has been reinforced for political purposes in the two regions. The workshop will address the current situation in the V4 and the WB countries, with a special focus on the Slovak national identity and its connections with the broader Central European region. The aim of the book launch is to take stock of the work in progress on identity and regionalism, and to clear new perspectives for European integration through a critical discussion of the book's multiple standpoints.
