Grading system	The Hungarian scale for grading contains just five grades: 5 (very good), 4 (good), 3 (average), 2 (satisfactory), 1 (insufficient). 2-5 are the passing grades, corresponding to D-A, respectively. There is no additional differentiation. We take the "average" designation of the middle grade, 3, seriously.

Housing information	Students can find accommodation in http://www.andrassyuni.eu/fur-studierende/leben-und-wohnen-in-budapest/wohnungsangebote from 300-600 € a month, but it is worth paying a bit more for a nice, renovated downtown flat with all necessary comfort. If someone is on a low budget, it is cheaper to get a flat outside the city centre area. If the flat is located close to the underground it will be easy to get to reach the centre, but be careful, one can travel an hour or even more from the outskirts. Most of the households are connected via internet. To get an offer it is best to search online apartment offers in advance, some providers offer flats for students. AUB also has a contract with CEU Residence Center, a private student dormitory service provider. You can find out more here .
