Inhalt und Ziele

Kursbeschreibung: The course will be held in English. The seminar will examine the development of Russo-American *Relations since the end of* the Cold War period and thereafter, in order to identify lasting trends and predict future developments and how the relationship between the US and Russia will influence the future course of the world in which we live.
